

s 2020 dragged into 2021, our continued inability to safely attend church services at the Cannery was disheartening. My concern was especially heavy in regards to our elementary-age girls because their online tutorial classes were unpopular and a struggle. I was uncertain whether they were paying attention during online worship or during the videos put out by Ethos Kids. As a result, I focused more on our family devotions and prayer times. I honestly did not think that much spiritual growth was taking place, but kept showing up for church each week. Imagine my surprise when after a church service, my 7 year old daughter, Celestine, declared that she wanted to be baptized with everyone else at the evening baptism service. Because I wasn't sure if she fully understood her decision, I told her that I first needed to check with her Ethos Kids Pastors, Ms. Carly and Ms. Brooke. I immediately contacted them to see if they wanted to meet with us or had any guidance for children who were considering dedicating their lives to Jesus and following Him in baptism. They suggested excellent resources and really facilitated the process. They also helped me to discuss this topic with my older daughter, who had made the decision to follow Jesus but did not feel ready to be baptized. Ms. Carly performed Celestine's baptism outdoors at Lipscomb's Baptism Pool on September 18th, 2021, with a small gathering of friends and family. We are so proud of Celestine's decision! It's just like God to take a year that looked grim and challenging, and in His grace, turn it into a year of tremendous spiritual growth for our family, which included the salvation of our younger daughter!

When I asked Celestine what she wanted to share about her relationship with God with our church family, she said, "Always trust Him. He knows what He's doing."

We are beyond thankful to see God at work, and He is not done! Our older daughter recently told me she wants to get baptized now as well! We are eagerly anticipating her baptism!"


# Power Up Clubs

Another evening, a mother in the neighborhood opened up about a personal struggle in her life and asked for prayer.

The Power Up Clubs served as a beautiful reminder that we are intentionally placed by God in our neighborhoods and locations around the city. It is our mission field, and the people around us are our God-orchestrated community. I love that Ethos doesn't ask children to come to US for a VBS, but we go to THEM. We bring Jesus into our streets and neighborhoods, making it easy and natural for others to encounter Him. Taking Power Up Clubs into areas all around our city has reminded me that church can happen anywhere, and especially with the people God has already placed around us. We don't have to go far to be the hands and feet of Jesus or to watch Him at work. In fact, it seems to happen more organically in our backyards and in our homes, where people feel welcomed, safe, and loved. Often, the best way to love and disciple others is to invite them into your everyday life, and let them see and experience the kind of life that Christ can bring. God is teaching me that often He uses the easy and simple acts of obedience to serve and love those around us, more than any extravagant plan or event ever could."



n 2021, I was invited to be a part of the Disciple Makers Cohort that Ethos beta tested. Although I didn't feel a strong yes or no from the Lord, it was in line with my growing interests and discipleship is obviously in His will so I decided to dive in. God used the cohort to not only give me great tools but also put more clear language to multiple things He's been teaching me in recent years. After months of meeting, it came time to start praying about the groups we would start and I had a handful of people in mind but hadn't pulled the trigger. As I was still chewing on the best way to approach it, someone who was on my list to consider for the group, texted a handful of friends saying she really wanted to start a small group and her approach was very similar to everything we'd just studied in the cohort. Not only that, but the other people she included on the text chain were the people I had on my mind/list to start the group with. The Lord had been separately building a hunger for something like this in all of us. We've started meeting now and God's hand in the group's formation is only one example of His involvement. I feel like a new journey has just begun and I'm looking forward to seeing what He has in store. It's not all roses and has been messy at times but I'm finding that's often what following Him can look like. (Proverbs 14:4) I continue to see that His ways are mysterious but worth walking in, one simple step at a time as I try to keep surrendering, seeking, and clinging to Him. He is more awesome than I can fathom."

# Freedom Prayer

itting in a Freedom Prayer time is one of my favorite places to be. It is the highest honor to sit with someone as they ask God the questions on their heart, forgive those who hurt them, repent of the sin entangling them, or lay down the lies they are believing before him. And every time, every time, God shows up. He encounters them. He shows them what he wants to do with the debt owed to them. He reveals to them where he was in their deepest hurt. He tells them the truth in his Word. He speaks identity over them. I watch the person who came into the room—nervous, unsure, worn, questioning, or desperate—leave feeling seen, known, loved, and more sure of his presence and character. I don't know if there is anything I'd rather do with my time.

These encounters remind me of Psalm 40 where David writes "I waited patiently for the Lord, and he turned to me and heard my cry for help. He brought me up from a desolate pit, out of the muddy clay, and set my feet on a rock, making my steps secure." The circumstances in the individual's life rarely change while they are in the prayer time. What changes is an encounter with God that lifts their eyes and heals their hearts."




# I can testify before God & people that I am free!

# Prayer & Fasting



or Awaken 2021, I took the month to memorize the sermon on the mount. While I had goals of building on that to memorize more throughout the year, those ambitions quickly fizzled out, but my aim in doing it was to plant Jesus' words in my mind so they would somehow become "part of me" and available to the Lord to speak. I figured when you love someone and want to know them better, learning their language is foundational...so I should learn the divine language of the Word to make that channel accessible for intimately knowing and be known by God.

The cool thing about it is there wasn't really a watershed moment where everything suddenly changed, but when I consider it, my perspective about who God was and what he desired matured and put down deeper roots. I look back and a lot of simple expressions from Jesus' teaching have more easily come to bubble up to the surface of my heart over the last year..."consider the Lilies," "treasures in Heaven," "where your money is there your heart will be also," "be careful not to do your acts of righteousness to be seen," "how much more will your father in Heaven give good gifts." So the discipline of 8 or 10 hours had an impact on 1,000 really, really small snap judgements over the rest of the year."

participated in Dwell by getting off social media and also doing a minor fast, not eating from sun up to sundown. I followed the reading guide and spent time with God each day, but did not feel like I got any big revelations or breakthrough moments with God during the fast. I was a little frustrated by that but I went to Ethos the following Sunday. That morning, we had some space to ask God some questions and listen for answers. During that time, God gave me SO many things that brought me so much clarity and peace and understanding about some situations in my life recently.

I've heard someone say in the past that fasting is not a way for us to get God's attention, but it's a way for God to get our attention. I believe that sometimes when we fast, God has something for us right then. But other times when we fast, it's so that we'll have a clearer focus to watch and listen for him when he does have something to reveal to us.

And the cherry on top of that day happened right after church. I got in my car and my phone started automatically playing a podcast episode that I have been listening to over the last few days about fasting. I had just gotten that clarifying message from God during church that I believe I only was able to hear & receive in its fullness because I had fasted the week before, and then this was the first thing said on the podcast:

"Sometimes fasting is just depositing into an account so that God can draw from it in the future."

Obviously that hit me right in the heart because God had that moment cued up for me in the car right after he gave me that message in church, coming off of the previous week where I felt disappointed that my fast didn't "produce anything." It meant a lot to me and will sustain me through future fasts."

### 8,300 CHILDREN IN DAVIDSON COUNTY IN FOSTER CARE



aleb and Ruchala Bone's eyes were opened to the considerable need for foster parents of children who are medically fragile when their oldest son underwent heart surgery as an infant. Now through the countless appointments, therapies, feedings, medication doses, meetings, phone calls, paperwork, and court dates, they have lovingly chosen each day to serve and obey the call God placed on their life.

They truly reflect God's ability to at the same time hold both mercy and justice, brokenness and redemption, joy and sorrow in a way that is beautiful to behold. They are bold advocates for their children in foster care and love them with the forever type of love that they deserve no matter the length of time they spend in their home. While at the same time, they love, serve, honor, and speak respectfully of the biological parents in ways that reflect the wholeness of their individual stories, their role in their children's lives, and their identities as fellow children of God. The complexities of the foster care system are immense but God's redemption, grace, and unconditional love are on display in their family through it."



It's hard to put into words all the ways we've seen the Lord work through our journey, it's been far more of Him changing our heart posture and teaching us that He is good even when He doesn't answer our prayers in the ways we hoped. And leading us to truly long for heaven where we'll finally see full healing and restoration.

We have very tangibly felt the Lord through our community. We felt confident in our yeses to the boys, but we could have never foreseen some of the circumstances we'd walk through. We've really been blown away with messages of people praying for us, loving all our kids so well, countless meal calendars and all the support we've felt over the last 3 years that eased some of the weight."

# The Global Church



thos Church is a gift from Jesus to my life, family and to our church ministry. UP Social (coffee shop and church plant site in Albania) almost closed last year. Ethos helped us from the Birthday gift and we were able to open again. UP Social is our second church plant and we have a lot of youth coming from all over the city. One youth, who is a tetraplegic, has a very difficult life. Her father told me that every month she wanted to commit suicide. More than twice she was saved by the doctors. Last year we started our youth ministry and she became part of the youth. There she heard about Jesus for the first time.

Her life changed totally. She declared this: 'Now I have a reason to live because Jesus died for me, for my sin, and he rose again so I can live with Him.'"

### A FEW UPDATES AMONG OUR GLOBAL CHURCHES

Ethos India hosted their combined Spiritual Retreat where 326 believers attended and 33 people were baptized.

Church partners in Albania helped 65 families in the winter with food and wood for heating. They were able to help 89 families with food and gifts at Easter.

The Roma Community Church in Serbia helped those who were greatly impacted by a flood in the Šainovac village. They sent humanitarian help which miraculously opened doors for a new home group! Amazingly, on their very first visit, 28 families gave their lives to Christ and accepted Jesus as their Lord.

# Radical Generosity

y name is Joey. My amazing wife Johanna, our children; Joey, Izzy and Jonathan, and I are so honored to call Ethos a part of our family. Together, we have planted The Movement Church here in Nashville.

About 7 years ago, while serving as Pastors in the Bronx, NY, we sensed God calling us into a new journey of church planting. That journey led us to Nashville, TN. When we arrived here 6 years ago, we couldn't have imagined how beautiful, yet challenging, this season would be. However, from the moment we arrived God has shown us His undeniable love and embrace in this new city. Within just a few months God tangibly displayed His love and embrace, connecting us to the Ethos family. Ethos has been a key part in this 6 year adventure for our family and ministry.

In 2019 The Movement Church officially launched, bringing to life a dream God birthed in us many years before. Our first year in ministry, although challenging, was defined by God's grace and favor. By January 2020 we had grown to about 100 people, impacting our community and growing in our relationship with Jesus. God was doing something so beautiful, and we were humbled to be a part of it. By March 2020 Covid challenged everything we had done and would do for years to come. Not only was it impactful on a global level, as we all know, but it also impacted every bit of our personal lives. As new church planters, in that moment it seemed like we were given an impossible task, with no answers of how to respond to a pandemic. How do we move forward? How do we lead a new church? How do we provide for our family? We had little to no answers for the many questions we were juggling.

Often as leaders, when faced with the tensions of challenge, we carry the burden of success and failure. Not only for ourselves, but for all those we are leading. In a moment when something needed to be done, the feeling of having no answers caused me to feel a brokenness and loneliness which left me reevaluating our call to Nashville and church planting. By the end of 2020, the need for direction seemed to be overwhelming. As I leaned into God more than ever before, I couldn't help but feel like everything we had worked for was slipping away. Maybe our time in Nashville was over?!



As 2021 began, as we waited on God (Psalm 46:10), in His faithfulness He began to respond. Our confession was to do whatever it was that He was calling us into. Or in this case, what He was calling us to continue! His words were "I am not done with Nashville". So we said 'Yes,' aligning our yes to His. There was a renewal happening in us. We began to sense the ability to dream for the future again. In doing so, a boldness was growing in us. We started praying for deeper, farther and greater impact and connection with this city. Our deepest prayer was that God would provide a home for our family. This would be a clear establishment and commitment to Nashville and the calling for our family. It would be a bold declaration that we are not going anywhere!

Through these past years, here in Nashville, I cannot account for the endless prayers and encouraging moments we have had with our Ethos family. In the past couple of years the impact and support has grown deeper and more intimate than ever before. What we are able to do on our own may be good, but together we accomplish greatness. As we began to see God renewing our call and passion for this city, a miracle was happening. It was a moment of God's greatness for us! God was answering the prayer of our hearts, He gave us a home! Ethos family, because of your commitment to the work of God in this city and our family, we were able to purchase a home this year. The generosity displayed by Ethos, towards our family, has truly been a display of God's love and affirmation to us. Our hearts are renewed! And as I said before, together we will continue the beautiful work God has called us to, here in our City! From the deepest parts of our hearts, Thank you for your generosity!




